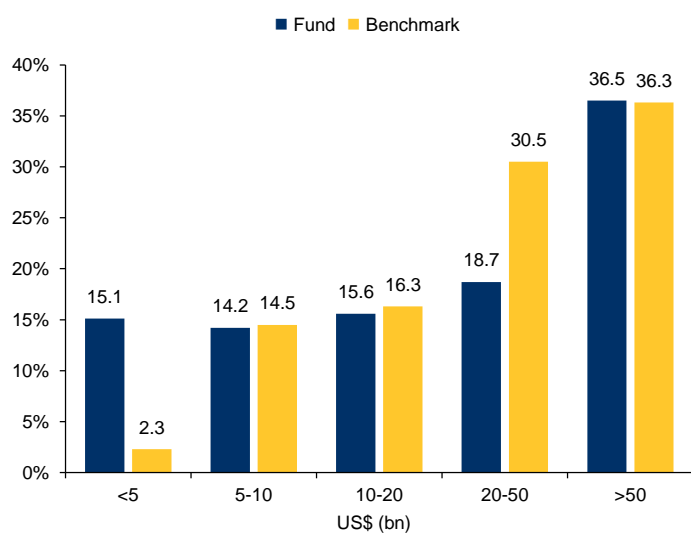

Market capitalisation distribution (%)

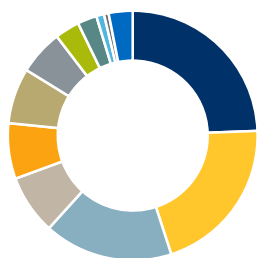
